#### **Back Park updates**

You may have noticed we have an updated sidewalk, new bench and bike racks at the park. The sidewalk was not in compliance with accessibility rules so this is the reason much of it needed replacement.

We also have had a request for more shade but due to the proximity of trees and playground fall zone, we were not able to add a stand alone shade structure. However, the park district is planning to replace the current swing set with a swing that has a large shade canopy built-in – similar to the photo. It will have the same number and types of swings. PARD will re-use the current swing at another location. The order has just been placed for the swing so the replacement should be within the next 6 to 8 weeks.

NEW INFORMATION: New sidewalk and bench was installed at the park. This was to make the sidewalk ADA compliant. They have assessed that they can not put a free standing canopy over the play equipment but they can put a swing set with canopy in. They will get to that in the next 8 weeks. The current swing set will be relocated to another Austin park.

#### 2022 Austin Energy Rate Base Review

This week, Austin Energy released its proposal to change base rates to address a growing gap between revenues and costs. Austin Energy needs a \$48 million base revenue increase, based on Fiscal Year 2021 financials. This means Austin Energy's base rates and rate structures are not meeting the costs of serving the community. This imbalance is not related to Winter Storm Uri. Austin Energy did not need to raise rates because of the storm.

To bring base rate financials back into balance, Austin Energy is proposing to:

- Adjust for higher operation and maintenance costs.
- Update an outdated residential base rate structure, which does not accurately recover the costs to serve customers.
- Better recover fixed costs by relying less on energy sales.
- Bring customers closer to what it costs to serve them, establishing more equitable charges as the community continues to grow.

• Base rate changes will ensure Austin Energy's financial stability, allowing the utility to continue delivering affordable, reliable electric service to the community.

If approved, Austin Energy's proposed base rate changes translate to an overall base rate increase of 7.6%.
