## What's New

#### Irrigation in the Median - thank you Bob Petersen

Our new roses (actually, ALL the roses) in the median have been struggling in the heat. We found that some of them are not getting water from the irrigation system and that we need more water going to all the median in general.

Thank you to Bob for taking a look at that and fixing it and also increasing the water.

#### **Bee Houses**

You will see 2 bee houses directly behind the north monument. These are for mason bees that are pollinators. They do not make honey or have a desire to sting you. The houses have holes and tubes that provide a place for mason bees to reproduce and gather pollen and nectar for their young. After laying eggs, the adults die, leaving a new generation to take over.

#### Neighborhood watch sign

Did you notice we have a new neighborhood watch sign at the front of the neighborhood? You may not have known that we had one already since it was so faded you could not even read it. Thanks to the Wegmann's for purchasing the sign and to Mike DiDio for installing it.

#### Silk Oak Park updates

**Back park** - We submitted a request for more shade over the play equipment but due to the proximity of trees and playground fall zone, we were not able to add a stand alone shade structure. However, the park district is planning to replace the current swing set with a swing that has a large shade canopy built-in. We are still waiting for that to happen.

## A message from our Zero Waste Block Leader...



Hey y'all! **The best way to collect kitchen scraps** is in a small compost bin or a similar container. You simply add kitchen scraps and unwanted leftovers to the kitchen compost bin during the week, then take the collected scraps to your outdoor, green bin whenever it is full or before weekly collection.

If you would like a kitchen bin please contact me.

#### Gently-used school supplies

If you are someone with a child that no longer needs school supplies from this past year please contact me. Also if you are a teacher who is in need of school supplies please contact me. I would like to facilitate an exchange of supplies to better improve teachers' lives and to prevent waste. More information to come in a future newsletter.

## Don't know what to do with it?

We had our bulk pick up in May but if you don't want to wait 6 months or a year for the next one, Austin organizations offer a place for your used items without the wait.

#### **Large Hauls**

If you've got a lot to give, like **clothing**, **furniture**, **appliances**, **entertainment** + **toys**, these organizations provide reused goods for those in need at affordable prices.

- <u>The Salvation Army</u> accepts car donations.
- Austin Habitat for Humanity ReStore offers furniture pickups.
- <u>Goodwill Central Texas</u> even has some **technology recycling centers** for bigger donations.

#### Clothing

 <u>Caritas of Austin</u> relies on donations of <u>linens</u> to provide <u>clothing</u> and a <u>place</u> to stay for individuals experiencing housing insecurities.

- <u>SAFE Austin</u> accepts **clothing**, **undergarments**, **and toiletries** to provide resources to families in need.
- Want to donate professional outfits? Donate them to the <u>Dress for Success Austin</u> so they can properly distribute clothing to those who are searching for careers.

#### **Kitchenware**

• <u>Casa Marianella</u> in East Austin accepts plates, silverware, pots and pans, and kitchen appliances that are underused or can be reused.

#### Childcare

- Austin Diaper Bank in North Austin provides diapers + wipes to families living in poverty.
- <u>Toybrary Austin</u> allows families to play with and "check out" toys for free. This is a great place to donate **toys with more life left in them**.

#### Technology

 If you have usable tech items like laptops, TVs, scanners, or smartphones, Travis County's <u>Recycle & Reuse Drop-off Center</u> collects technology.

#### **Furniture**

- <u>Austin Habitat for Humanity</u> uses **donated equipment + furniture** to build homes —
  whether you have leftovers from a project you didn't complete or can **reuse supplies**from a remodel. It will also pick up pre-approved car donations.
- Room Service Vintage accepts vintage furniture for resale.



## Zilker Shuttle Running on Weekends

The Parks and Recreation Department is running a pilot program to explore alternative transportation and parking options for Zilker Metropolitan Park.

We would love for you to share with your neighbors about the program that began June 25.

The free shuttle service to Zilker Metropolitan Park from the One Texas Center parking garage operates through Labor Day, Monday, September 5, 2022.

Here are the details:

- The shuttle operates 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. every Saturday and Sunday, and on Labor Day
- Park in the One Texas Center parking garage, 505 Barton Springs Rd.
- Get parking ticket validated by the shuttle driver
- Drop-off location is at Zilker Playground/Barton Springs Spillway, a two-minute walk to Barton Springs Pool
- No dogs or other pets allowed on shuttle
